The Port of Salem

A small city just north of Boston, Salem attracts visitors from around the globe. Most noted for the Salem Witch Trials of 1692, Salem's history stretches from the 17th century to today and includes maritime heritage, American literature, architecture, military history, and more.



Location & Access

- Salem is 16 miles (25 km) north of Boston
- Salem is a 30-minute drive from Gloucester, and 24 miles (37 km) from historic Lexington and Concord, Massachusetts.
- High-speed Salem Ferry service between Salem and Boston is available May-October.
- Commuter train service between Salem and Boston's North Station takes 30 minutes and is available daily, year-round.
- Receptive and hop-on tour guides are available
