As part of Mayor's Night Out on **Friday, October 6**, there will be a Trick-or-Treat activity for Salem children who are dressed up in costumes, which has been hugely successful over the past few years. Participating businesses will be passing out candy throughout Downtown Salem, as well as across Pickering Wharf. Trick-or-treaters will be able to walk up to the front of businesses and grab candy as they enjoy the two-hour-long festivity. This year Pickering Wharf will also be joining in on the festivities, handing out candy and boasting new decorations to light up the wharf for the season. After Mayor's Night out concludes, there will be a free screening of *Hocus Pocus* on the Salem Common.

To make the most out of the Salem Haunted Happenings experience, visitors should plan ahead by making reservations and purchasing tickets where available. Not everyone has brooms, so there are some things to consider about transportation and parking to navigate the city during Salem Haunted Happenings:

- Due to the record-breaking crowds due to Salem this season, visitors will save time, money, and the inevitable frustration experienced when people get stuck in the downtown traffic jams by planning to use public transportation or the satellite parking options.
- Additional commuter rail trains are running to Salem in October. For a schedule, visit www.mbta.com/cr
- Parking rates have increased and are subject to change. Up to 2 hours parked in a City Garage costs \$20,and stays over two hours cost \$50 during October weekends.
- Parking in resident-only areas will result in fines of \$75 and cars will be towed.
- The free parking shuttles include an accessible bus that will stop at Salem High School and Jefferson Avenue lots, as well as Riley Plaza.
- The nearest MBTA Garages are located at 252 Bridge Street in Salem, 325 Broad Street in Lynn, and 100 Rantoul Street in Beverly. The train ride from Lynn or Beverly to Salem is less than five minutes.
- The MBTA Garage and adjacent surface lot in Salem will be closed to entering and exiting vehicles between 6 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on Halloween night.
